Krusinski to expand and renovate Tinley Park medical office building



This renovation and expansion project at Pronger Smith MedicalCare in Tinley Park, Ill., is Krusinski Construction Company's second medical office building for Irgens Development Partners, LLC.

Krusinski Construction Company is building a 37,800-square-foot addition at Pronger Smith MedicalCare in Tinley Park, Ill.

The expansion will make way for a new imaging suite that will include magnetic resonance imaging, ultrasound, physical therapy and treatment rooms; obstetrics suite; and a pediatrics wing. A new basement will include a break room, bathrooms and support offices. In addition, the project includes a significant renovation and expansion of the main reception area and parking lot improvement. Construction is slated for completion in July 2010.

This is Krusinski's second project for Irgens Development Partners, LLC, which has offices in Milwaukee, Chicago and Phoenix. Krusinski was general contractor for another Irgens project, Remington Medical Commons, a two-story, 38,752-square-foot building in Bolingbrook, Ill. Last year, Remington became the first building in Illinois to be recognized for sustainable design and construction under the Green Globes™ environmental assessment and rating system for commercial buildings.

"We are very pleased to be working for Irgens on a second medical office building," says Jeff Krusinski, project executive for Krusinski Construction Company. "We look forward to our continued partnership and another successful

project.”

Irgens will seek Green Globes certification for Pronger Smith MedicalCare, 17495 S. LaGrange Road. The center has 50 physicians who represent most medical specialties and perform minor outpatient procedures on site.

The architect for the project is Brubaker Architects in Wilmette, Ill.
